This course is intended for students who have little or no sailing experience but want to learn to sail the right way, and for first mates who want to be able to understand the basics of sailing so they can take the helm and safely enjoy the ride. The course covers basic sailing in daytime, terminology, skipper and crew functions, sailing theory and practice, basic knots, boat handling, crew overboard, USCG required safety gear, and more. This certification prepares students to act as skipper and crew on boats up to about 20 ft in length, by daytime in light to moderate wind and sea conditions. Successful candidates also earn a National Safe Boating Certificate approved by National Association of Boating Law Administrators (NASBLA) and the United States Coast Guard. As such, this course meets the requirements for mandatory education and licensing for every state in the United States.

This course builds upon Basic Keelboat Sailing (ASA 101) and your prior sailing experience on small boats to learn coastal cruising safely in boats 22 to 30 ft in length. The course covers basic coastal cruising in day time, in moderate wind and seas conditions, interpretation of marine weather forecasts, skipper and crew duties, seamanship, reading and interpretation of NOAA nautical charts, anchoring, additional knots, docking, and more.

This course combines Basic Sailing (ASA 101) and Basic Coastal Cruising (ASA 103) and is ideally suited for students who are light on experience but want to learn cruising the right way, and for first mates who want to be able to take things in their own hands should the need arise. The course covers basic sailing and cruising in light to moderate wind and sea conditions in day time, terminology, functions, knots, "rules of the road," boat handling under sail and power, nautical chart reading, USCG required safety gear, and much more. With experience, this certification prepares students to act as skipper and crew on vessels up to about 30 ft in length, by daytime in light to moderate wind and sea conditions. Without plenty of experience, this course does *not* qualify an individual to bareboat charter a yacht.

This course is open to all levels. The course covers coastal navigational theory required to safely navigate a vessel in coastal and inland waters. Certification requires successful demonstration of knowledge of charts symbols and conventions on U.S. nautical charts, identifying sources of official U.S. Coast Guard navigation publications, using deviation tables, tide and current tables, application of current and leeway, set and drift, aids to navigation, navigation equipment and tools, position plotting, and much more. This is a classroom only course and no on-the-water sailing is required.

This course is specifically intended for sailors with Bareboat Charter (104) certification and cruising experience who want to learn to sail and experience a cruising catamaran. The course covers terminology, construction and skills unique to multi-hulls, crew overboard, handling under sail, docking, anchoring, and much more. This course can be taken by itself or can be combined with 104 (see Live-Aboard courses).
